slothfulness, laziness, directionless, profitless, procrastination.

1 Peter 5:7-9a

7 Casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you. 8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. 9 Resist him, steadfast in the faith,

Casting grk: epiripto

The throwing away from you or the casting of a stone into the sea.

to get rid of an object.

Sober grk: ne'pho

to abstain from cloudiness, fuzziness or drunkenness – buzzed.

to keep yourself clear-minded.

Vigilant grk: gregoreuo, gray-gor-yoo'-o

to keep awake, watchful, on-guard.

About grk: peri'pa'teo

To walk or to pace in and around. (meaning - demonic entities, satan being the chief among them) search for, press upon, peer in to, seek out an opening or

opportunity = temptation is the manifestation that a demon is at work around you,

near you, or upon you.

Devour grk: ka'ta'pi'no

to drink down or to suck moister from. to swallow or drink your life away from

you. (many who have encountered demonic activity report that there is a

manifestation of weight or pressure & a pulling of breath or the sucking of air out

of the lungs)

Resist grk: anthistemi

to be set in battle array against an invader, to withstand, repel, to be in direct – face to face opposition to the enemy. (woke wont work)

Satan and his workers cannot endure "The Sword of the Spirit." It is without fail and always spiritually lethal.

Hidden heb: tsaphan

to treasure up, to fill up or to pack or stuff to the full.

to keep secret to keep stored up, to bank. (to deposit upon a deposit)

This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all. 6 If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. 7 But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin. 8 If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 10 If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us.

Verse 3

3 For consider Him - - who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls.

Consider grk: analogizomai

Settle your thoughts upon. think deeply.

Endured grk: hu'po'me'no

To stay under the pressure of, (3), patiently endure(1), perseveres(1), persevering(1), remained(1), stayed

behind(1).

Hostility grk: anti'logi'a

rejection, rebellion, to refuse, to dismiss, to not take seriously, to brush off.

Weary grk: kam'no

worn out, fatigued, sick as in exhausted in body or mind.

Discouraged grk: ek'lu'o

to be loose, to be untied or released from the moorings, to grow tried, weak, faint.
