Romans 14:1-12

Receive one who is weak in the faith, but not to disputes over doubtful things.

2 For one believes he may eat all things, but he who is weak eats only vegetables.

3 Let not him who eats despise him who does not eat, and let not him who does not eat judge him who eats; for God has received him. 4 Who are you to judge another's servant? To his own master he stands or falls. Indeed, he will be made to stand, for God is able to make him stand. 5 One person esteems one day above another; another esteems every day alike. Let each be fully convinced in his own mind. 6 He who observes the day, observes it to the Lord; and he who does not observe the day, to the Lord he does not observe it. He who eats, eats to the Lord, for he gives God thanks; and he who does not eat, to the Lord he does not eat, and gives God thanks. 7 For none of us lives to himself, and no one dies to himself. 8 For if we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. Therefore, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. 9 For to this end Christ {Messiah} died and rose and lived again, that He might be Lord of both the dead and the living. 10 But why do you judge your brother? Or why do you show contempt for your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. {Messiah} 11 For it is written: "As I live, says the LORD, every knee shall bow to Me, and every tongue shall confess to God." 12 So then each of us shall give account of himself to God."

Romans 14:11-12

11 For it is written: "As I live, says the LORD, every knee shall bow to Me, and every tongue shall confess to God." **12** So then each of us shall give account of himself to God.

The gravity of these two verses should cause us all to step back in to take a deep breath and to realize that we are to walk before God humbly, and in love toward others.

Micah 6:8

He has shown you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?

And yet again, we see, the God of the Scriptures, He who is personal, and it is He who desires you to know Him in a real and living way.

Not remotely. Not distant. Not removed, But Present.

But the God of the Bible declares Himself to be Present - that He is Personally Aware. He is the Great Constant and yet, above all things, He desires us to know Him in Reality, with a deep and spiritual intimacy...

Romans 1:16-17

1a.) Maturity produces a practical faith

vs. 1

Romans 14:1

Receive one who is weak in the faith, but not (do not receive them with conditions) to disputes over doubtful things.

Receives grk: proslambano

to bring in or to take alongside of, to open your arms to or to welcome in, to make welcome, accepted.

Christ Jesus came to save us from our sins & give us a new identity.

John 1:12-13

But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: **13** who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

Weak grk: astheneo;

feeble, sensitive (in the negative) sickly or prone to feebleness of spirit or faith, implying a lack of spiritual freedom and power. narrow. limited.

Romans 15:1-2 NLT

We who are strong must be considerate of those who are sensitive about things like this. We must not just please ourselves. 2 We should help others do

what is right and build them up (bring them along) in the Lord.

Disputes grk: diakrisis

the act of passing judgment upon another, to hold someone in a lesser-state or a

low opinion. to assume a superior authority that you do not have.

Doubtful grk: dialogismos

things being reasoned about, arguments, speculations, to judge another man's

thoughts, conviction, to judge what they are thinking.

"In Essentials, Unity; In nonessentials, Liberty; in all things, Charity."

But what is a {Practical Faith} & How Does It Work?

Colossians 2:16-17

So let no one judge you in food or in drink, or regarding a festival or a new moon or sabbaths, **17** which are a shadow of things to come, but the substance is of Christ.

Mark 7:14-16

1b.) Maturity produces a compassionate faith

vs. 2

Romans 14:2

2 For one believes he may eat all things, but he who is weak eats only vegetables.

In The Pagan Roman World – Idol Worship Prevailed. This was not a dietary issue as much as it was an issue of the conscious.

1 Corinthians 8:1-13 NLT

Now regarding your question about food that has been offered to idols. Yes, we know that "we all have knowledge" about this issue. But while knowledge makes us feel important, it is love that strengthens the church. 2 Anyone who claims to know all the answers doesn't really know very much. 3 But the person who loves God is the one whom God recognizes. 4 So, what about eating meat that has been offered to idols? Well, we all know that an idol is not really a god and that there is only one God. 5 There may be so-called gods both in heaven and on earth, and some people actually worship many gods and many lords. 6 But for us, there is one God, the Father, by whom all things were created, and for whom we live. And there is one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things were created, and through whom we live. 7 However, not all believers know this. Some are accustomed to thinking of idols as being real, so when they eat food that has been offered to idols, they think of it as the worship of real gods, and their weak consciences are violated. 8 It's true that we can't win God's approval by what we eat. We don't lose anything if we don't eat it, and we don't gain anything if we do. 9 But you must be careful so that your freedom does not cause others with a weaker conscience to stumble. 10 For if others see you—with your "superior knowledge"—eating in the temple of an idol, won't they be encouraged to violate their conscience by eating food that has been offered to an idol? 11 So because of your superior knowledge, a weak believer for whom Christ died will be destroyed. 12 And when you sin against other believers by encouraging them to do something they believe is wrong, you are sinning against Christ. 13 So if what I eat causes another believer to sin, I will never eat meat again as long as I live—for I don't want to cause another believer to stumble.

1 Corinthians 16:13-14 NIV

Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong. 14 Do everything in love.

Acts 15:8-9

So God, who knows the heart, acknowledged them by giving them the Holy Spirit, just as He did to us, **9** and made no distinction between us and them, purifying their hearts by faith.

But what is a {Compassionate Faith} & How Does It Work?

1 Corinthians 10:23-32

All things are lawful for me, but not all things are helpful; all things are lawful for me, but not all things edify. 24 Let no one seek his own, but each one the other's well-being. 25 Eat whatever is sold in the meat market, asking no questions for conscience' sake; 26 for "the earth is the LORD'S, and all its fullness." 27 If any of those who do not believe invites you to dinner, and you desire to go, eat whatever is set before you, asking no question for conscience' sake. 28 But if anyone says to you, "This was offered to idols," do not eat it for the sake of the one who told you, and for conscience' sake; for "the earth is the LORD'S, and all its fullness." 29 "Conscience," I say, not your own, but that of the other. For why is my liberty judged by another man's conscience? 30 But if I partake with thanks, why am I evil spoken of for the food over which I give thanks? 31 Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God. 32 Give no offense, either to the Jews or to the Greeks

1c.) Maturity produces a unifying faith

vs. 3

3 Let not him who eats despise him who does not eat, and let not him who does not eat judge him who eats; for God has received him.

But Never Mixing the Order

2 Corinthians 6:14

Do not be unequally yoked together with unbelievers. For what fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness? And what communion has light with darkness?

Despise grk: exoutheneo

to view as contemptible, to see as not worthy enough, to view another less than yourself, to elevate oneself above another.

Judge

grk: krino

to pass judgment upon, to conclude, to hold in condemn of your standard, to stand up and give a condemning testimony against a brother or sister or family member.

There is no greater example known in human history than

that of the apostle Paul and his ability to understand what it means to be a true follower of Christ.

Here is such an example - apart from Jesus.
